



*RECIPE FOR CLASS 91 - Carrot Cake

250ml sunflower oil
225g light muscovado sugar
3 large eggs
225g self-raising flour
large pinch salt
½ tsp each of ground mixed spice; nutmeg and cinnamon
250g carrots grated

Topping

50g unsalted butter at room temperature 225g full-fat cream cheese such as Philadelphia 25g golden icing sugar ½ tsp vanilla extract

Using a hand held mixer whisk the sunflower oil and muscovado sugar together to combine and then whisk in the eggs one at a time. Sift the flour, salt and spices together and then fold into the sugar and egg mixture. Fold in the carrots.

Divide the mixture between two 18cm greased and base lined sandwich tins. Bake for 30-40 minutes 180C/160c fan oven/Gas mark 4 until a skewer inserted into centre comes out clean. Leave in tins for 10 mins then turn out onto wire rack.

To make the frosting beat together the butter and cream cheese until light and fluffy. Sift the icing sugar and add with the vanilla extract and mix well. Use to fill and top the cake. Decorate as required.



- No entries whatsoever will be accepted after the date shown. Postal entries, together with the appropriate fees, may be sent to the show secretaries to arrive no later than Friday 31st August 2018.
- Registration for all classes will be taken at the Village Hall, Wellow on the following dates: -

THURSDAY 30th August 19.00 - 21.00 FRIDAY 31st August 15.00 - 20.00

- 3. An exhibitor may make any number of entries in a class but is eligible for only one prize.
- 4. The Committee reserves the right to visit the garden of any exhibitor, who must show all produce in a growing state.
- 5. Exhibits must be placed in the 'Flower and Produce Marquee' between 8.00 and 10.00 on the day of the Show.
- 6. No person, other than the stewards and judges may enter the marquee after 10.00am until the Show opens.
- 7. The judge's decisions are final. A judge may withhold an award if in his/her opinion an exhibit is of insufficient merit to make a lesser award.
- 8. No exhibit shall be removed from the 'Flower and Produce Marquee' until after 17.00. Any produce left will be sold by auction.
- 9. Cups and other awards will be presented on the day. Prize monies will be paid out at the Treasurer's tent between 15.30 and 17.00 Monies not claimed by 17.30 will be deemed to have been donated to the Society's funds.
- 10. Cups remain the property of the Society and holders are held responsible for any loss or damage incurred while in their possession.
- 11. The Committee will take all reasonable care of exhibits but will not be liable for any loss or damage.
- 12. All communications regarding entries or other matters should be sent to the Flower Show Secretaries Bridget Woollen 2 Tucking Mill Cottages, Midford (01225 835024) or Avril Greig, Manor Stables Farm Lane, Wellow BA2 8QU (01225 837878) Points are scored in each class: First 3 points, Second 2 points and Third 1 point.
