9. Proposed changes to the Constitution for approval

The proposed changes had been circulated previously.

10. Discussions on:

a) Village Show

This agenda item specifically had been widely publicised prior to the meeting.

The Village Show is run by the "Village Show Team", and the Flower Show (ie everything inside the marquee) is run by the Hort Soc. All are volunteers.

The Show has existed in various forms since before the 2nd World War, and has been held annually every year except during the war and Covid year. It used to be a Farmer's show, and changed over the years to become what it is now.

The issues to discuss :

- Change to a Sunday
- Change to late July
- Change the format to reduce the number of volunteers needed
- Change to a biennial Show

There was a lengthy discussion, led by Sophie Hart who leads the Village Show Team.

Moving the day to Sunday was proposed :

- To gain more engagement with the Flower Show element – to enable people, and especially working parents, to use the Saturday to prepare their entries. This should generate more engagement.
- To give the organisers more time (ie all Saturday)

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to set up the marquee and ground generally. In the past some volunteers have taken a day's leave from work on the Friday to do this.

- From gardening perspective, it doesn't matter whether the Show is on a Saturday or Sunday

Most people were happy for the change. Some reservations were expressed - about not getting a day of rest before going back to work on Monday, and from some church-goers.

Changing the date to a weekend in July, before the end of the school terms

- It was felt that it would be easier for volunteers and more efficient for the show to run before the summer holiday period rather than after.
- This will engage the school entrants much more - with the immediacy of competing in the Show (and winning prizes!) once the entries have been completed.
- From a gardening perspective, there would need to be a change in some of the vegetables, fruit and flowers classes in the Show – not a problem – but the later in July the Show is, the wider the range of vegetables, fruit and flowers there will be.

The consensus was to :

Move the Show to July, towards the end of the school term Agreed

Move the day to a Sunday
In 2026, this would mean a date of 12th July 2026. Agreed

Change the format to reduce the number of volunteers needed

The meeting agreed this was up to the Village Show Team and the Flower Show Secretaries to organise Agreed

Change to a biennial Show

The meeting agreed to keep the Show an annual event. Agreed

- b) Membership fees

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The membership fees have been unchanged for over 10 years.

We discussed increasing the membership fee and offering more – free events, free entry to the Village Show etc, and leaving the fees unchanged in 2026 while offering more to justify an increase in 2027.

We agreed to better promote the benefits of being a member, while increasing the amount of events and activities in 2026 and leaving the fee unchanged, and review again in a year's time.

Agreed

The Society has changed its bank – and the new bank details should be promoted by the Committee now.

Agreed

c) Garden Party style

The garden party – a picnic - in June this year was in a new format – courtesy of the Wylds and their lovely garden, with swimming pool. We had children for the first time, which brought a new dimension, and a paid-for BBQ and drinks for those who didn't bring their own picnic.

Going forward, we agreed that the host and the layout of their garden would dictate the style and character of the party.

d) Ideas for events and activities in 2026

A list of options was displayed and discussed, and left with the Committee to act on.

Agreed

The plan is for the Plant Sale, Garden Party, Village/Flower Show and Apple day to be annual fixtures, with at least one event/activity offered to members each month.

11. Election of committee members

Louise Nicolai and Jill Tremellen stood down at the AGM.

Rick Halle, Hugh Prentice, Mari Bartholomew, Pam

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Pyke, Lynne Williams, Marchelle Farrell, and Oli Watkinson put their names forward to be committee members.

As the constitution allows for up to 12 members, the 7 people listed above are elected for a term of up to three years. All elected unanimously.

12. Presentation of awards

The meeting paused for several minutes while children, some of whom are prize-winners, joined the meeting, with some of their families.
